Luke 17:1 NKJ [Jesus] said to the disciples, "It is impossible that no offenses should come,"

B. Recognize the _____

Luke 17:1-3 "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. Pay attention to yourselves!"

Skandalon: a stick for bait (of a trap), generally a snare, a stumbling block, an offense

2 Timothy 2:24-26 "And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, correcting his opponents with gentleness. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, after being captured by him to do his will."
