

# Sermon Discussion Guide - April 28, 2019

SERIES – WISDOM: The Key To A Happy Life TITLE - "Why Wisdom?"

1 Corinthians 1:20-25

**SUMMARY** – Everybody wants it. Not everybody uses it even if they have it. It is important to living life to the fullest. What is it? Wisdom! This three week series will take an deep look into this important subject. We find that Wisdom is something that can be passed on from generation to generation, but can also be neglected or intentionally dismissed. What makes someone wise? Can we be wise in some ways and not in others? Lets explore together this week "WHY" wisdom is important.

#### **DAILY STUDY & PRAYER**

#### Read / Reflect / Respond

(READ the verse, take a moment to REFLECT on its meaning, RESPOND by writing down some thoughts and praying)

**Monday - Proverbs 8:35–36** "For whoever finds me [wisdom] finds life and obtains favor from the Lord, but he who fails to find me injures himself; all who hate me love death."

Tuesday - 1 Corinthians 1:24 "Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God."

Wednesday - Proverbs 3:13 "Blessed is the one who finds wisdom, and the one who gets understanding,"

**Thursday – 1 Corinthians 1:20** "Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?"

Friday - John 10:10 Jesus said, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly."

**Saturday** – **1 Corinthians 1:25** "For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men."

#### GROUP DISCUSSION

(This is only a guide – select the points you want to discuss or supplement with your own materials)

Open with Prayer

- 1. What is something you remember from the sermon that stood out to you or never heard before?
- 2. Who is someone in your life who has passed down "godly wisdom" to you? What made them wise?
- 3. In what ways can Wisdom be an issue of life and death? What are physical and spiritual examples?
- 4. Why is the wisdom of this world and with wisdom of God in such conflict? Why do some people see the gospel as foolishness? Why does scripture say that God's wisdom makes human's appear foolish?

Close with prayer requests and prayer

# **NEXT STEPS** (Optional for group discussion)

- 1. TEMPERATURE GAUGE How am I doing when it comes to being wise? How would I rate myself on a scale of 1-10?
- 2. RESPOND How is the Lord calling me to respond? In confession and repentance? Prayer for help and guidance? Seeking out a confidant or listening ear? Take a moment to write down one action step.
- 3. PRACTICE What is one way that you can incorporate or practice increasing your wisdom this week?



### **Sermon Discussion Guide Leader Notes**

## **Preparing to Lead Your Group**

- ✓ PRAY for insight as you begin to prepare for leading your group. Ask for God's wisdom, that the Holy Spirit will be the teacher and that you will be God's instrument to lead the group to greater understanding and a willingness to commit to becoming more like God. Prayer should be your primary source of personal preparation for leading your group!
- ✓ **PLAN** where you want to take your group during the next series. Is your group strong in some areas and weak in others? How can you challenge the members to live more balanced Christian lives?
- ✓ **EVALUATE** after each session and at the end of a series. Reflect on what went well and what didn't. Reevaluation is key to your growth as a leader. How are you doing with leading the discussion: is it stimulating, challenging, and meaningful? Are you able to keep the group on track? Do you need to make some changes?

- The questions with Bible verses associated with them are there to encourage Bible literacy. So encourage different people to open their Bibles and read selected verses if they are willing and able.
- Your goal as the leader is to bring the group into a stimulating discussion that helps the members recognize their needs for personal life change. Ultimately you want them to be willing to commit to change with accountability to the group. Accountability helps us to persevere in our commitments and achieve the blessings of success.
